

Floor plan is working out

Consolidated Carpet was retained to resolve office flooring challenges at the New York City Office of the Public Administrator.

The New York City Office of the Public Administrator requested that Consolidated utilize FreeAxez' Low Profile Access Floor to transform the space into a modern office supporting current technology requirements and city employees.

Occupying space in the Surrogate Courthouse at 31 Chambers Street, the New York City Office of the Public Administrator is housed in a Landmark Beaux Arts-style building built between 1899 and 1911.

The challenge was to find a solution that would allow for flexible placement of electrical/data ports, eliminate the need for costly and damaging core drilling and address the challenge of navigating Landmark-designated double wooden doors which swung into the workplace.

Before FreeAxez, data and voice system cables had to be in fixed locations, behind walls or under dropped ceilings, making installation and access complicated. FreeAxez' noiseless, heavy-load bearing, all steel construction does not require fasteners, tools or adhesives, and can be used on concrete slabs.

It is also GreenSpec listed, qualifies for LEED credits in five categories, is approved for non plenum-rated cabling and is made with recycled steel that is 100% recyclable and refundable.
